In January, we'll be learning about the well-known author of children's stories like *The Mitten* and *The Hat*, Jan Brett. Using various recollection strategies, students will be able to use their sequencing skills to accurately retell the stories in their own words. We'll follow this up with a brief study of our country of the month - Canada. After talking about the lovely Canadian weather and a few native animals that prefer a colder environment, we'll spend the rest of the month talking about seasonal themes.

A lot of pre-k students have told me this year that winter is their favorite season and that they love the cold! We'll talk about our favorite and least favorite winter activities and all the things that you can do with snow. If there is snow on the ground, we'll bring some in to look at under a microscope and maybe make some connections to why their teacher always asks them to stop eating it. Pre-k students will study arctic animals and learn about surviving in the cold, as well as animals that hibernate. We'll turn the cozy corner into a bear's den for students to try out.

## Miss Sarah's Pre K News

HAPPY NEW YEAR! WELCOME TO JANUARY 2026! AS WE BEGIN THE NEW YEAR IN THE PRE K ROOM, LET US REFLECT BACK ON ALL THE LEARNING ACTIVITIES THAT WE HAVE EXPERIENCED IN 2025. NOW THAT 2026 IS HERE, THE BEST IS YET TO COME AND THE FUTURE IS OUT THERE WAITING TO BE DISCOVERED. WE HOPE THIS YEAR IS FULL OF MANY NEW LEARNING EXPERIENCES FOR YOUR CHILD!

THIS MONTH, WE WILL FOCUS ON THE THEME OF WINTER. WE WILL USE OUR SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY SKILLS TO FIND OUT HOW SNOWFLAKES FORM FROM WATER VAPOR AND TURN INTO AN ICE CRYSTAL, THEN A SNOW CRYSTAL AND FINALLY INTO A SNOWFLAKE. WE'LL ALSO LEARN AND EXPERIMENT TO SEE IF BIG OR SMALL SNOWFLAKES MAKE THE BEST SNOWMEN. OF COURSE, WE WILL FIRST NEED SOME SNOW FOR THIS ACTIVITY! WE WILL USE OUR MATH SKILLS TO FIND OUT WHAT SHAPES AND SIZES SNOWFLAKES CAN BE ALONG WITH HOW MANY SIDES THERE ARE IN EACH SNOWFLAKE. WE WILL ALSO READ WINTER THEMED BOOKS IN OUR READING CENTER SUCH AS "SNOWMEN AT NIGHT" AND "SNEEZY THE SNOWMAN. WE WILL ALSO READ BOOKS BY OUR AUTHOR OF THE MONTH, JAN BRETT, WHO WROTE "THE MITTEN" AND "THE HAT" AMONG OTHERS. FOR ART AND MOVEMENT DISCOVERY, WE WILL EXPLORE WHAT WILL HAPPEN WHEN WE MIX ICE CUBES WITH PAINT FOR AN INTERESTING ART PROJECT. OUR SNOW BALL TOSS GAME WILL HELP THE STUDENTS WORK ON THEIR GROSS MOTOR SKILLS. WE WILL ALSO DISCUSS ARCTIC ANIMALS SUCH AS POLAR BEARS, PENGUINS, AND MOOSE AND HOW THEY KEEP WARM IN THEIR COLD ENVIRONMENT.

THE LAST WEEK OF JANUARY, WE WILL BE TALKING ABOUT HIBERNATION, AND WHICH ANIMALS HIBERNATE AND WHICH ANIMALS DON'T. THERE WILL BE HANDS ON ACTIVITIES TO HELP US EXPLORE THIS CONCEPT.

OUR ARTIST OF THE MONTH IS JACKSON POLLOCK, HIS PAINTING TECHNIQUE IS A LITTLE DIFFERENT. HE CREATED ACTION PAINTING, WHICH INCLUDES THROWING AND SPATTERING PAINT FROM LARGE PAINT BRUSHES ONTO PAPER. THIS COULD GET A BIT MESSY, BUT OH SO FUN!

OUR COUNTRY OF THE MONTH IS CANADA, AND WE WILL DISCUSS THEIR FLAG AS WELL AS SOME FACTS ABOUT OUR NEIGHBOR TO THE NORTH.
