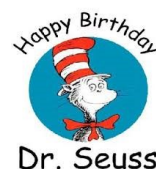
We'll also have an opportunity to catch a leprechaun! We will build a trap to set out during nap time to see if anyone can catch him!

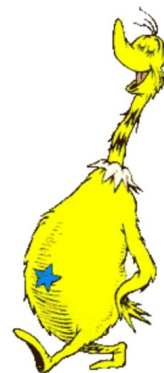

WELCOME TO THE WINDY MONTH OF MARCH! THIS MONTH, WE WILL BE FOCUSING ON CELEBRATING DR. SEUSS'S BIRTHDAY WITH A VARIETY OF FUN LEARNING ACTIVITIES THAT ARE ASSOCIATED WITH THIS MANY STORIES BY DR. SEUSS. WE WILL START WITH A FOCUS ON LITERACY SKILLS IN THE CLASSROOM, AND AT HOME WITH MAKING A "CAT IN THE HAT" HAT WITH RED AND WHITE PAPER STRIPS. CHECK YOUR CHILD'S CUBBY BASKET FOR THE DETAILS! WE WILL ALSO LEARN ABOUT RHYMING WORDS AND USE OUR EMERGENT WRITING SKILLS TO WRITE WORDS THAT RHYME SUCH AS CAT, HAT, BAT ETC. DR. March 2023 Health & Child Development News

What are the four most frequent health issues that young children develop?

1. **OBESITY**—As a parent, you can take preventative measures to ensure that your child will avoid this health problem. Portion sizes and types of food are very important things that we can control as parents. We can also monitor our child's nutrition and actively encourage exercise. Did you know that the center serves both a vegetable and a fruit with lunch? Even when kids don't like eating fruits and vegetables, we encourage a "No thank you bite" to get them to try new foods. AND, many of our students will tell you—vegetables are so much better with ranch dressing! The center also allots for two times per day for outside play or gross motor play when the weather is uncooperative. In total, the kids have an hour per day to take part in physical activity here at school.

3. **ASTHMA**—It can seem very overwhelming when your child is diagnosed with asthma, but the good news is that it is controllable and doesn't impact children's lives as much as you might think. If there are certain triggers that cause your child's asthma (extremely cold temperatures, dust, pets etc) you are (to a certain degree) able to control them and obviously, medication is available from your pediatrician to help control asthma (inhalers or nebulizers).
4. **SKIN CONDITIONS**—Eczema is a common skin condition in children and it is treatable with medicated lotions/ointments prescribed by a doctor, but can be very itchy and painful. In a lot of instances, it will go away as the child gets older. Psoriasis is different than eczema though, and is thought to be more of a psychosomatic condition that is aggravated by stress, so monitor your child for stress factors and take appropriate measures to try to alleviate stress triggers. Psoriasis often lasts a lifetime.
5. **MENTAL HEALTH**—Many children deal with varying degrees of depression and anxiety. The key is, don't focus on the depression or anxiety—focus on helping them deal with the issue. Provide a safe space to talk about feelings and discuss coping mechanisms that may help. If the depression/anxiety persists, seek medical help through counseling. And, if depression is severe, seek medical treatment immediately.

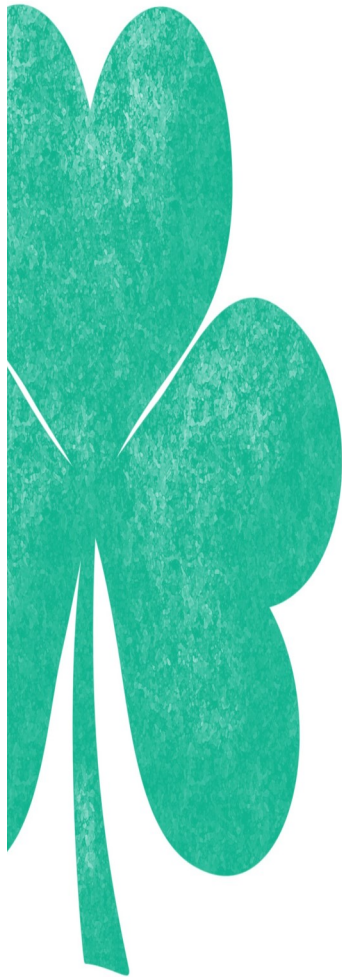
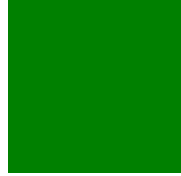
